Colour in the fibre arts is an exciting media when used skillfully. This informative illustrated seminar will demonstrate a view of colour use through a variety of fibre techniques. William will draw from his extensive background to show practical ways to improve your use of colour. Examples will be shown from tapestry, fabric weaving, fabric collage, and beading.

## **Adventures in Beading**

One beader's travels though the world of beading. William will trace his involvement with beads from the early bead weaving to the making of his own glass beads. Along the way we will see examples of many different beading techniques. This seminar will be of particular interest to those interested in getting involved with beads but do not know where to start.

# **Historic and Contemporary Beading Techniques**

This seminar will look at a number of historic examples of beading and their contemporary application. The presentation will be supported with images as well as actual pieces that will demonstrate how history affects our work today.

## The D word

This lighthearted visual seminar will focus on the development of the participant's creativity through **D**esign. The intricacies of design will be demystified through practical examples and the development of a specific design vocabulary. #### The Path to Handmade Glass beads

William Hodge illustrates the path a fibre artist has taken to the creation of original glass beads. He demonstrates how he has moved through many different art forms to get to their current passion.

All design, especially fibre design, is based on Symmetry. This illustrated presentation demonstrates the basis of design symmetry and how they are applied in the visual arts with emphasis on the needle arts. Specific examples will be shown and discussed. Robert & William will demystify the intricacies of this valuable design tool. Although a self-contained presentation this material leads to some of this years hands-on workshops.
